Purpose of this self-assessment: In accordance with College of Science and USU guidelines, the Biology Department is committed to evaluating our progress toward meeting the Learning Objectives established as part of the training in Biology M.S. and Ph.D. programs. These objectives were determined by the Graduate Programs Committee and approved by the entire faculty. Each learning objective is assessed yearly and the results are used to refine and improve our program in order to meet graduate student needs. The Annual Professional Development Plan is one component of this assessment.

Graduate students meet with their supervisory committees at least once per year to share a progress report on their coursework, research activities and teaching activities (if applicable). To assist the student and committee in that discussion of progress and to address any challenges or weaknesses, the student is asked to prepare the following self-assessment of progress. This assessment will communicate how the student feels about their progress, while the committee will provide an assessment based on their interactions with the student and the student's progress report. The comparison of the student's and committee's assessment should reveal:

- Strengths to be recognized and leveraged for continued success
- Weaknesses to be addressed through focused training and mentorship
- Development areas that may need clarification of expectations

Overview of this assessment: The College of Science has standardized expectations for annual review of graduate students. The annual review includes the following components:

- ✓ Completion or update of an Individual Development Plan (IDP) by the student. (link here)
- ✓ A self-evaluation by the student, submitted to the major professor and thesis/dissertation committee.
- ✓ A committee meeting that includes the student, major professor, and the rest of the committee members.
- ✓ A written response (this form) following the committee meeting addressing student academic progress, including specific feedback on the student self-evaluation. The signed form should be placed in the student file.

Instructions for students: Reflect on your Individual Development Plan and the goals for your training established with your major advisor and advisory committee. Please indicate how you feel in terms of meeting expectations for the various benchmarks outlined below. For benchmarks that are not relevant (or not <u>yet</u> relevant), mark N/A for not applicable. The student should also share 1) a progress report (oral presentation or written report) and 2) an up-to-date curriculum vita.

Instructions for committee members: Review the student's self-assessment during the annual committee meeting and mark each benchmark to reflect your determination as to the student's progress. Discuss any differences in assessment with the student and document feedback, as well as an individualized plan to address deficiencies, in the form below. After all committee members approve and sign, the form is sent to the student for additional comments and approval. Once signed, the form is sent to the GPC to be added to the student file.
